#### NAMALAKA NEWS

Here are highlights of a report from dear friend Bishop Montfort Stima about developments in our sister parish: "Projects are ongoing in the village of Namalaka to complete the new Father's house (rectory). In addition to the house itself, there is also a separate kitchen and garage and "boys quarters." A well and sinking of a water pump are in the works to complete the plumbing and bring water to the area. Also the power company has been paid and is now challenged to bring poles and lines out to the village to complete the electricity project. The number of people with electricity in their homes is around 10%. He shared with us some "food for thought" as he is ever looking ahead to the next need or project. There are two health clinics in the area that our Pastor Fr. Saulos is in charge of running in addition to his leadership of the parish and pastors duties. The future may involve the renovation of the old rectory into a convent to accommodate the nuns/sisters who would be invited to take over the management of the clinics. As a future possible project we may find ourselves supporting this." Questions? Marie Hedden 206-948-5166.

## Numbers 27: 12-23
