# **INTRODUCING JUDITH**

# Judith chapters 1: 1–8:8

The first seven chapters of Judith tell us about the terrible times that the people of God were suffering. After years of captivity they had returned to their homeland, but now a new danger had appeared. Holofernes, a general of King Nebuchadnezzar of Assyria, led an army that had so far been unstoppable. Nebuchadnezzar wanted to be worshiped like a god. He planned to destroy cities and remove local nature religions with a new religion. Instead of worshiping the gods that the people felt protected their cities, this Assyrian king wanted the people to worship only him. Of course the Jews would not worship any God but our one true God. Fearful of being destroyed, the people of Jerusalem got ready for a long war. They prayed constantly. Judith, a widow, prayed and fasted constantly. She was a wealthy and beautiful woman. All her fortune and honor she pledged to God.

# **LEVI FOLLOWS JESUS**

# Luke 5: 27-35

In Bible times, a tax collector didn't just collect taxes. Tax collectors were disliked or hated for two reasons. First, the taxes people had to pay didn't improve their lives or their country. Instead, the taxes were sent to Rome to build up the army and to make rich Romans even richer. The Romans used local people as tax collectors because they could speak the language. Tax collectors often took more money than they should. One famous tax collector was Zacchaeus. whose life changed when he met Jesus. Levi, who was also called Matthew, was sitting one day at the table of the tax collectors when Jesus came along and said only, "Follow me." Without any hesitation, Levi simply walked away from the tax collector table. For the rest of his life, he followed Jesus. Matthew wrote the Gospel of Matthew so that we would know Jesus.


