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#### PART 2-CONTINUATION OF LETTER FROM BISHOPS OF MALAWI TO GOVERNMENT

We (the bishops of Malawi) cannot sit back and watch in the face of shrinking standards or lack of public service delivery, increasing gap between rich and poor, lack of fiscal discipline and misplaced priorities in the prevailing tough times which call for tough measures. The letter highlights the concerns on the shortage of maize (a type of field corn, the main form of sustenance) in the country and the exorbitant prices, as well as being deeply worried by the bad performance of the economy. The Church also said it is concerned about "new trends in our society that promote a culture of death instead of a culture of life such as the abortion campaign. Because of that the family and the institution of marriage between man and woman are under direct attack from those campaigning for homosexual rights and unions." On the decline of social services, the bishops noted that many district hospitals have scaled down their operations with their ambulance services grounded, their medical supplies drastically reduced to a few essential drugs and provision of meals to patients reduced to only one meal per day. "The deepening healthcare crisis across the country requires special attention from our government." The church reminds the leadership of the country that most poor Malawians depend on public service delivery financed by the government. "Consequently, limited or lack of funding is tantamount to denying them access to better services in education , health, agriculture and water, among many other services. This hugely compromises the right to development and a decent life for many.

In the Catholic Church we have a tabernacle where the consecrated host—the Body of Christ—is saved.


The ancient Hebrews had a tabernacle where the Bread of the Presence was saved. It makes sense that both kinds of taberna-

There was a wonderful man named Bezalel who was chosen by God to decorate the tabernacle out in the wilderness. The ancient Hebrews had escaped from Egypt and were slowly making their way to the Promised Land.

You can read about Bezalel in chapter 31 of Exodus. Here are the things he knew how to do. He knew how to do



embroidery, how to make gold or silver or bronze items, and how to cut and mount precious stones. Bezalel also knew how to carve wood, make garments for the priests, and even knew how to make perfumed oils. Bezalel was kept so busy that he was given an assistant named Oholiab. The tabernacle must have been a very beautiful place!

#### **SPIRITUAL ADOPTION UPDATE**

In January many of our parishioners spiritually adopted newly conceived babies, making a commitment to pray daily as they grow and develop. Those babies are now 12 weeks old. Their feet are perfectly shaped. Eyelids, nails and fingerprints are already developed. Their entire body is sensitive to touch and can feel pain. They sleep and wake regularly. Vigorous activity shows distinct individuality. The babies can kick, turn their feet, make fists, move their thumbs, bend their wrists, turn their heads, open their mouths and press their lips tightly together. They "breath" amniotic fluid to help develop their respiratory systems, all pretty amazing for only 12 weeks old. Please remember to pray daily for thee little ones! *"Psalm 139:13, 14. Truly you formed my inmost being; you knit me in my mother's womb. I give you thanks that I am fearfully, wonderfully made; wonderful are your works."*


