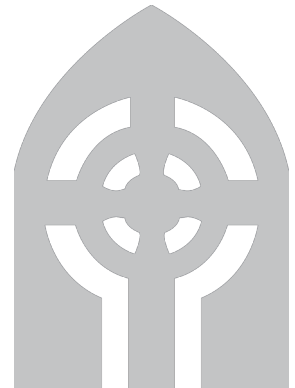

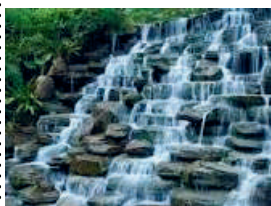
MALAWI MOMENTS

The delegation from our Sister Parish Namalaka has been here 3 weeks now and leaves 10/31. They have visited the youth group, children's faith formation, bible study, the school, an RCIA class, sang in our concert and preached at our Mission Sunday Masses. Fr. Chris shared stories that have left a lasting impression. Namely, that Jesus charged us with the responsibility to tell the story of His love for all humankind—to pass that from sister to sister and brother to brother. He told a story of a man who wanted to be a priest but had physical limitations that would prevent him from performing the duties required. He went home and made two beautiful pairs of shoes that he presented to the parish priest telling him that he should wear these shoes and that wherever he would travel and visit that he would take the shoemaker's love and care with him. This is to say that we cannot all be priests and travel that road but we can support them in their works and send love and care along the path. We cannot all travel to Malawi to be with our brothers and sisters in Namalaka but we can be with them in support and prayer in whatever way God has called us to. **Please come to meet, greet and eat the free Malawi meal Saturday night and the send off Square Dance on Sunday. 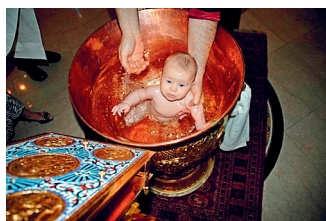
How Real Things Become Holy Things
