Old Testament INTRODUCING TOBIT Tobit 1: 1–22

When the Assyrians took over Israel they moved many of the people to Assyria. That is how Tobit's family came to live in Ninevah. Tobit was a good man who loved God. Before the exile, he had always traveled the long journey to Jerusalem for major feast days. Tobit was a descendant of Jacob's son Naphtali. Naphtali was one of the tribes that are sometimes called the "Ten Lost Tribes." He was generous to orphans and widows, and to people who were friends of the Israelites. He married Anna and they had a son named Tobiah. Tobit and his family kept the Jewish "kosher" laws, or the laws of eating only the food that is approved for Jews to eat. Many Jews in Assyria were killed in those years. Tobit buried them in secret, and he found many other ways to honor God.

New Testament INTRODUCING JOHN THE BAPTIST Luke 3: 1-20

John the Baptist was the son of Zechariah and Elizabeth. His parents knew that the birth of John was a miracle because the Angel Gabriel had appeared to Zechariah and announced that they would have a child. So from the beginning his life was dedicated to God. In fact, he was filled with the Holy Spirit when Elizabeth heard the sound of Mary's voice. During the time when Pontius Pilate was the ruler of Judea and Herod was the ruler of Galilee, John began his preaching and baptizing. He preached a baptism of repentance, which means that he baptized people who were truly sorry for their sins and who wanted to follow God's laws. He called on people to share with the poor, to be content with their pay, and to treat others fairly. He made it clear that he was not the Messiah, "but there is one to come who is mightier than I."


