Old Testament

SIMON THE WISE HIGH PRIEST

1 Maccabees 13:7—14:49

After Jonathan was captured, it was up to his brother Simon to carry on the resistance against Judah's enemies. Simon became the high priest. His first task was to try to save his brother who was a captive.

The enemy general Trypho sent this message—that if Simon would send money and Jonathan's two sons as hostages, AND if Jonathan would sign a paper promising not to fight any more, he could be set free. Simon met these demands even though he knew that it was a trick. Sure enough, Trypho had Jonathan killed, and the people of Judah mourned him for many days. As the high priest, Simon was so faithful to the law that he was asked to be the high priest permanently "until a prophet should arise." The land was at rest during his priesthood.

New Testament

A BOY POSSESSED BY DEMONS

Luke 9: 37-43

We might wonder why so many demons are mentioned in the Bible. When Jesus the Son of God came as a full human being to live among us-he was still God. The word Incarnate means "in the flesh" and that is why Jesus is called God Incarnate. It's not too surprising that the demons—who have no bodies of their own-decided to inhabit the bodies of weak or helpless people. When Jesus came down from the mountain where he had shown his glory to Peter, James, and John, they saw a large crowd. A desperately worried father came up to Jesus, begging him to heal his son who was possessed by a demon.

"Jesus rebuked the unclean spirit, cured the boy, and restored him to his father. And all who saw it marveled at the greatness of God."

Luke 9: 42a

- ♦ The cloud and the pillar of fire that led the people to the promised land
- The fire that did not burn up the burning bush

- ♦ The still small voice that spoke to Elijah

Hello from Brigette and Kerri! It has been a busy few days in Malawi! We landed at about 12:30 pm on July 4th and waited until about 4:00 pm for our bags. Then we were off for the 3+ hour drive to the Bishop's house in Mangochi. Friday we had Mass at 6:30 am and then toured around the township, Utawaleza (the diocesan farm), can you say bananas? Then we found the internet at Zabuli as well as sand volleyball and of course green. Saturday we were at the cathedral for Fr. Daniel Pio's Jubilee celebration. Most of the priests for the diocese were there including Fr. Chris and Fr. Davie. Sunday we celebrated Mass at Kausi parish and had lunch. Today we visited Liwonde National park and saw lots of elephants and hippos. Tomorrow we will visit Mua cultural center. Wednesday we will make our way to Namalaka for several days and do work on the list from Fr. Wichert and our parish. It has been a wonderful time thus far. As usual, I cannot say enough good things about the people of Malawi and their faith. We are both excellent at bucket baths and as I am typing this there is a black out so we are sitting outside in the dark! More later from Namalaka! (Fr.
