Old Testament

JONATHAN TAKES OVER

1 Maccabees 5: 1–13: 5

Time traveled on and Judas the son of Mattathias grew older as the warrior leader of the Jews. There were so many attacks that the community was at war for a long time. Judas made an alliance with Rome, as he thought that would help him against the Greeks who had created so many problems for the Jews in Jerusalem. Judas died in a battle against the Greeks.

Jonathan and Simon buried the body of their brother. After Judas's death, it was clear that someone from the same family should be the ruler. Jonathan was a wise ruler, making friends of the strong nations around him without losing his faith in God. But in the end he was tricked, his army destroyed, and he died in battle. Simon took over at a time of great suffering. He was the High Priest of the great Temple in Jerusalem.

New Testament

PETER & THE GLORY OF THE LORD

Luke 9: 18-36

Catholics recognize Peter as our first Pope. Two great events when he traveled with Jesus show us that he understood God's plan in sending Jesus into the world. When Jesus was by himself praying, his disciples were with him. He asked if they knew who he was. The crowds were saying "John the Baptist." Others were saying that Jesus was actually Elijah come down from Heaven. But Peter spoke up and said that he was the Messiah of God. Jesus warned his disciples that He would suffer, be put to death, and then rise on the third day. Eight days later Jesus took Peter, James, and John up the mountain with him where he was glorified before their eyes. Moses and Elijah came to the mountain to speak to Jesus about what would happen in Jerusalem.

SPIRITUAL ADOPTION UPDATE-5TH MONTH

"Mommy felt me kick today!" This month marks the half-way point to birth and the baby is very active. Sleep habits develop and his mother can feel him move and stretch, particularly when he is resting. He is big and strong enough to kick hard against the outside uterine wall and dent it. Up to now, although he swam with ease in his watery world, he was too small for her to detect because the inside wall of the uterus has little feeling. The babies' hair and eyebrows begin to grow. The ears are fully formed and the baby responds to sound. He is able to hear his mother's heartbeat and voice. Many moms begin to sing to their baby at this stage. Babies born at this age have survived.
