Old Testament

ESTHER PRAYS FOR HER PEOPLE

Esther chapters B, 4, & C

In King Arthxerxes' court, Esther had some influence with the king, but only under certain conditions. For example, she couldn't contact him. He could only contact her. If anyone appeared in the presence of the king without an invitation, they could be killed UNLESS the king held out a scepter toward that person.

Esther heard that Mordecai was dressing in sackcloth and ashes as a sign of mourning for the evil that Haman was planning against the Jews. A letter had gone out to all the provinces that on a certain day, all the Jews would be killed. Mordecai sent word to Esther, "Do not think that because you are in the king's palace, you alone of all the Jews will escape. It was for such a time as this that you obtained the royal favor." Esther knew that his words were true. She took courage, put on sackcloth and ashes, and prayed. She decided, "Contrary to the law, I will go to the king. And if I perish, I perish."

New Testament

WOMEN DISCIPLES

Luke 7: 36-8: 3

Although the original apostles were men, many women were Jesus' disciples. A Pharisee named Simon invited Jesus to eat dinner with him. We don't know how many other people were at the dinner. While they were eating, a woman came in with an expensive vase of perfumed oil. She stood near Jesus, crying so much that her tears fell on his feet. She began to wipe off the tears with her hair, and also washed and perfumed his feet with the scented oil. Remember that foot washing was usually done by slaves. Jesus forgave her for her sins, and wouldn't let anyone criticize her in his presence. Other women who followed him had experience of his goodness. Mary Magdalene had had demons expelled. Joanna, Susanna, and others helped Jesus and the disciples by providing their own money.

SPIRITUAL ADOPTION, FOURTH MONTH

"I Had a Dream Today!" Our spiritually adopted babies are already four months old and they are now six inches in length. They can grasp with their hands, swim freely and turn somersaults. The ears are developing and there is evidence that they can hear mom's voice and heartbeat, as well as some eternal voices. The baby's brain has begun maturing—a process that will continue until she is about 14 years old. Her taste buds are now working and three hundred liters of fluid a day are sent to the baby via the umbilical cord. The baby' heart pumps six galls of blood every day. Fine hair begins to grow on her head, eyebrows and eyelashes. Facial expressions similar to the baby's parents can be seen at this time. This month REM'S (rapid eye movements) have been recorded—a sign of dreaming. Please continue to pray for our spiritually adopted babies and their mothers.
