Statement from the Bishops of the Archdiocese of Seattle about recent tragic shootings

Seattle, Wash. - News of the tragic shootings in California, Mississippi, Texas and Ohio has once again struck our nation to its core, as loved ones of all ages are suddenly and senselessly ripped from their families. Many others suffer life-threatening injuries, and still countless more are afraid and anxious. The violence must stop.

As disciples of Jesus, we live by the way of peace and reject all forms of violence, hate and racism. This terrible spike in senseless acts of terror brings us to our knees, as we pray for victims and their families, for the perpetrators of these heinous crimes, and for those prone for whatever reason to violent acts. May God bring peace and consolation to them all and teach us to be instruments of healing and reconciliation – not just at the present moment, but every day.

We need to find a way to enact common-sense gun regulation and seek more effective means of assisting those with mental illness. May we ourselves, with God's grace, be people who sow and cultivate a culture of peace, goodness and kindness every day – in both word and deed. The road to peace begins with a fervent commitment on the part of each of us to respect all human life and let the Lord's gift of peace reign over us.

O God, who have revealed that peacemakers are called your children, show us now the power of your goodness and healing as we weep for those suddenly and violently taken from us and for those who have been injured in any way. O God, merciful and strong, swiftly banish violence from our nation, wipe away all tears, and help us establish the kind of justice that ensures true and lasting peace, that we may live as your children, as brothers and sisters of one family. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

ANTIOCHUS BECOMES AN ENEMY

1 Macabees chapter 15

Antiochus wrote a friendly letter to Simon, who was the ruler of Jerusalem and Judea. He promised to grant Simon all the rights and privileges that the Jews had enjoyed in the past. He also promised that he would not invade their country and that they would not be taxed. The Romans were becoming very strong all over the ancient world. Simon sent letters and gifts—such as a massive gold shield—to make friends with them. The Roman ruler was ready for an alliance with the Jewish people. The relationship with the Romans would become very important in the time of Jesus' presence here on earth.

Antiochus broke all his promises to Simon. His officers began to trap and kill members of the Jewish population—secretly at first but then more openly as his soldiers began to patrol the roads.

New Testament THE SEVENTY-TWO DISCIPLES

Luke 10:1-20

We've often heard of the twelve disciples who followed Jesus wherever he went. Actually, Jesus had many disciples. He knew each one by name and had something special for each disciple to do. Jesus has something special for you and for each of us to do.

He sent out the 72 disciples two by two. They had certain rules—no walking stick, no traveling bag, and barefoot. Even now many Christians go barefoot like those early disciples. They were to go into a friendly house in the village and stay there healing the sick, casting out demons, and accepting gratefully whatever food or drink was given to them.

When they came back to Jesus, they were very excited about the miracles they had prayed for and received. Jesus said, "I saw Satan fall like lightning!"





CALLED TO SERVE AS CHRIST CAMPAIGN

Everyone Will Be Asked to Consider a Sacrificial Gift

The Called to as Serve Christ campaign is coming, and we hope to reach out to every person in the Archdiocese of Seattle, as we know each person can help accomplish so much. When asked to do something big, whether a project or donation, it is often easiest to take the biggest piece and divide it into smaller parts. Making your gift into a pledge can help maximize your ability to support the worthy goals of the Called to Serve as Christ campaign. Breaking down payments into annual, semi-annual, quarterly or even monthly payments can help you budget your gift. If a family of four is asked to consider a gift of \$3,600 to the campaign, it may seem like too much to do at one time. If the family divides it annually, it may seem more manageable at \$1,200 over three years. But, even more manageable, if the family chooses to break it down even further, to monthly, it would come out to \$100 per month over three years, or about the amount the family might spend eating out at a restaurant during the month. Each family will need to decide on their own what is appropriate and meaningful for their specific situation. Soon, Archbishop Sartain will ask each of us to consider a gift in the hopes that all of us pledge to support the campaign's important goals in some way. He will ask us to ask ourselves: What can we sacrifice for the next three years for these goals?


