#### **A MYSTERIOUS FIRE**

#### **2 Macabees chapter 1**

The second book of the Maccabees is different from the first book. 2 Maccabees seems to be a collection of histories written down to give the people courage during a difficult time.

The Jews in Jerusalem wrote a letter to the Jews in Egypt to encourage them to remain true to God's laws and to give thanks to God for the restoring of the Temple.

Antiochus who had caused so much trouble to the Jews in Jerusalem was finally defeated by Persians who made him walk into a trap. For this the Jews all over the world were grateful, as it gave them more freedom to worship.

One joyful day the Jews found a cave where many years before, the temple fire had been hidden. How happy they were when the water in the cave burst into flame.

#### **New Testament**

#### **THE GOOD SAMARITAN**

#### **Luke 10: 25-37**

Jesus told the story of the Good Samaritan in answer to a man's question. The man was a lawyer, meaning that he faithfully studied Jewish laws. He had heard about eternal life and wanted to know what he needed to do in order to live forever.

As he often did, Jesus asked the man a question. "What is written in the law?" The man replied that one should love the Lord with all his or her heart, soul, and mind, and "your neighbor as yourself."

Jesus then told the story about a man from Samaria who stopped and helped a Jewish man who had been robbed, beaten, and left to die. Samaritans and Jews usually didn't spend time with each other. This story remind the lawyer that each of us has the responsibility to help others, even our enemies.
