Old Testament

JOB'S THREE FRIENDS: Conversation in most of the chapters

Job's three friends who come to visit him in his trouble are named Eliphaz, Bildad, and Zophar. For a whole week they just sit on the ground with him, so sad about his troubles that they really didn't know what to say. Finally Job begins to complain. He wonders why all this tragedy has come into his life. "I have no peace nor ease. I have no rest, for trouble comes!" (*Job 3: 26*)

Eliphaz tries to answer him. He points out that God disciplines the people he loves.

Bildad says that God will restore Job's fortunes.

Zophar reminds Job that he should not question God's actions.

To all of his friends Job replies that he has a right to complain and that no one has ever suffered as much as he is suffering now.

New Testament

THE LOST SHEEP AND THE LOST COIN

Luke 15: 1-10

These two parables (stories with a meaning) are not really about sheep or coins, but they are about God's amazing love for all of us. Jesus asks what shepherd would not risk everything to go and find the little lost sheep. Many shepherds would say that the lost sheep is less important than the ones who are already safe. But the Good Shepherd doesn't see it that way. He wants the lost sheep to be found. In just the same way, God gives all of his love to one person who may not be loved by other people.

The woman who loses a coin is also part of a story about God's love for us. God doesn't want any of us to be lost. Just as the woman sweeps her whole house to find the coin, in that same way God does everything possible to bring back a person who needs help.

MY FAITH

The Communion of Saints

Do you ever wonder what happens to the saints who have died? We are sure they are in Heaven with Jesus, but we don't know how they live or what they do. They have the joy of seeing Jesus and Mary face to face.

We believe that they also pray for us. For example, St. Thomas is the patron saint of people who have trouble believing. St. Anthony is the patron saint of people who lose things, and many people pray to him to help find their glasses.

Also, you can pray to saints to pray for you. We call this the Communion of Saints.

BIBLE BOOKS:

WISDOM is a book that was written about 100 years before Jesus was born in Bethlehem. Wisdom means wanting to learn what is right.

Every person's finances and family situation is different. Jesus makes it clear that it matters not how much one gives, but that it is planned, calculated, at least somewhat sacrificial (see Luke 24:1-4), and not simply from what is "leftover" at the end of the month. We propose the tithe (10%) as the ideal every family can consider working towards. This means taking steps to give 5% to one's parish, and 5% to other charities or causes you have personal passion for. 27TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

When will I have given enough—of my income, of my time, of my talents? Today's Gospel suggests that only *total* stewardship will do: "When you have done all you have been commanded to say, 'We are useless servants. We have done no more than our duty.'"

CALLED TO SERVE AS CHRIST CAMPAIGN

Q: How did the Archdiocese decide what amount to ask my family?

A: Ask amounts were set by looking at a number of factors, including: an offertory snapshot, parishioners' giving history to the Annual Catholic Appeal, other archdiocesan giving history (golf tournament, Crozier Society, etc.), planning study responses, other public knowledge of philanthropic giving, and an evaluation done by the parish.



The archdiocese has no way of knowing what a family's personal financial situation, income or obligations are. Capital campaigns are about extraordinary giving toward extraordinary goals. To accomplish these goals, every parish family must be challenged to consider a gift above and beyond their regular support to their parish and the Appeal.

The amount of a gift or pledge is a personal decision.
