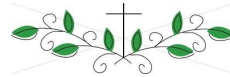

Old Testament THE ADVENTURES OF JOB

Job Begins to Suffer (Job 1 & 2)

Sometimes in the Bible we meet friends who are very good people. For example, Boaz was kind to Ruth when she was a total stranger. The Good Samaritan was kind to a man who had been beaten up and left for dead.

Job was this kind of person. The book actually begins with a conversation between God and one of the fallen angels. The fallen angel points out that Job, who is rich and very fortunate, might not be such a good person if God took away all of his blessings. Would Job still praise and honor God? Suddenly Job's "luck" changes and his blessings begins to disappear.

All of his children die in dust storms. All of his animals are taken away by raiders. And Job develops a terrible disease of his skin. His friends feel very sorry for him

New Testament THE RICH AND THE POOR Luke 14: 7-24

Jesus often ate with rich people when he was invited to their houses. People loved to hear him talk. His enemies especially wanted him to talk so they could argue with him. Arguing with Jesus was sure to fail, because he has perfect wisdom and knows the hearts of all people.

Jesus said, when you go to a fancy dinner, and there are important people there, be sure to take the least important place. Even if you are a very important person, you might meet new friends by sitting with people who are not so fortunate.

He had an even better idea. How about giving a banquet and inviting only poor people who can never pay you back? That way, you would meet some of God's dearest friends, the poor people of the world.

MY FAITH VOCATIONS Who Will I Be?

The Church needs people who love Jesus. The decisions you make about your grown-up life will have a big effect on the Church.

HOLY ORDERS is the Sacrament for men who are called to be priests and deacons. A bishop is already a priest before he becomes a bishop.

MATRIMONY is the Sacrament of a man and a woman living together married and being open to the gift of children.

RELIGIOUS LIFE is the vocation of devoting your life to prayer and good works. The Religious pray with others in community, often living in the same place.

BIBLE BOOKS: SONG OF SONGS is a collection of poems about love between husband and wife, or God and his people.

The sin of the rich man in today's parable was not that he was rich, but that he failed to share his wealth with the beggar at his gate. He knew Lazarus, perhaps walked by him every time he came in or out, but did nothing to relieve his suffering. Is there a Lazarus in my life? What am I doing to help?

CALLED TO SERVE AS CHRIST CAMPAIGN

Why should the Archdiocese assist individual women religious orders through the *Called to Serve as Christ* campaign?



Sisters who have and will serve in the Archdiocese need and deserve an adequate and dignified retirement. With the assistance of women religious leaders serving in our Archdiocese, we have identified a strategy to address their needs through this campaign. Some women religious orders face similar issues paralleling archdiocesan priests. Aiding the sisters' pension and healthcare needs will allow them to continue their ministries, sharing God's love and presence with others.

As a greater number of women religious age compared to the increase in new vocations, the Archdiocese seeks to ensure each order's stability and longevity for their ministries. Their missions reach those in our community whose needs are typically unmet by the government and secular charities. Their work empowers the student and the sick, the destitute and the down-trodden, to reach their God-given potential.

Seven legacy orders of women religious will each receive one-eighth of the women religious portion of the campaign. Expanded ministry congregations, those whose provincial headquarters are located outside of the Archdiocese but expanded their ministry to the Pacific Northwest, will receive the remaining one-eighth of the funds to distribute among themselves.
