### **Old Testament**

#### **JEREMIAH and the CLAY JAR** **Jeremiah Chapters 2-18**

Jeremiah always told the people the message that God gave him. He never said no to God. Mostly he talked about problems the people could solve by obeying God at home and in their own city of Jerusalem.

Jeremiah's "rules" might have looked like this:

- ◆ Love God and remember what God has done for his people.
- ◆ Do not try to get help from Egypt or other countries.
- ◆ Do not worship the images you have made.
- ◆ Do not harm your children.
- ◆ Follow God's law faithfully.

Jeremiah was told to take a common clay pitcher and to smash it to pieces in front of the people. That was to warn them that the army to the north (Babylonians) would soon be in Jerusalem.

### **New Testament**

#### **PROUD PEOPLE AND HUMBLE PEOPLE**

#### **Luke 18: 9-17**

It's good to be happy about your talents and accomplishments. But it isn't good to think that you are better than other people, or more important in God's eyes.

Jesus often taught this to his disciples. He told a story about a religious leader who followed all the rules. He would go to the temple to pray to God, but really he was just telling God how wonderful his own life was, compared to other people. In the temple at the same time a tax collector was praying, someone who was hated by many people. Knowing that he was a sinner, this man only asked God for mercy, Disciples tried to keep children away from Jesus. Jesus scolded his disciples for thinking they were more important. He said that all must enter the kingdom of God with a child's trusting attitude.

### **MY FAITH**

#### **How Do We Know about God?**

We know God because God REVEALS himself to us. Deep in our hearts we want to worship God. But God sometimes seems so far away. Can we see him in the stars? In the ocean tides? When the wind sings through the trees? Actually, God does work through nature to teach us about his goodness. But mainly we know about God by the wonderful things he has done—creating the world, saving Noah from the flood, talking to Moses in the burning bush, but most of all raising Jesus from the dead.

**Books of the Bible**  
**BARUCH** was the secretary to Jeremiah. This book is about the sadness of the Jewish people as they went into exile, and their prayers to return.
