John was born in Philadelphia, PA and shortly thereafter experienced his earliest memories in Malawi, Africa, where his parents served as medical missionaries. His family relocated to North Seattle, where he began grade school at St Mark in Shoreline and eventually graduated from Shorecrest High School. John studied Human Biology at Fastern Washington University and



Shorecrest High School. John studied Human Biology at Eastern Washington University and Physical Therapy at the University of Washington prior to embarking on a twenty-year career as a Physical Therapist. He also spent over a decade competing internationally and coaching flatwater kayaking racing.

In order to live out his passion for helping others navigate their life with Christ, John entered two years of religious life in 2012. In 2016 John subsequently discerned the call to enter seminary for the Archdiocese of Seattle and is currently studying Theology at Mundelein Seminary near Chicago.

As part of the formation program, John will be serving as a pastoral intern here at St. Brendan from early February through mid-May. God willing, he will be ordained to the transitional deaconate in the summer of 2021 and the priesthood a year later. Please join us in welcoming John!

SAINTS THIS WEEK

(adapted from <u>Companion to the Calendar</u> by Mary Ellen Hynes)

February 22—The Chair of St. Peter

In pagan times in Rome February 22 was "Ancestors' Day." People remembered the dead, especially their parents. The Christians of Rome began to celebrate this day in memory of St. Peter, their spiritual father, their first bishop. Peter had come to Rome because Rome was the center of the empire and a center of the new Christian faith. Why is today's feast called the Chair of St. Peter? Every bishop has a chair from which he presides and preaches. In Rome, the basilica of St. Peter, an ancient wooden chair is preserved because it is thought to have been St. Peter's The Latin word for a bishop's chair is cathedra, which is the home church of the bishop in each diocese. We honor the Unity of the Catholic Church.

New Testament

THE SAMARITAN WOMAN

John 4: 4-42

In the time when Jesus walked on the earth, Samaria was a part of the Holy land that is north of Jerusalem and south of Galilee. People who lived in Galilee either walked through Samaria or they walked around the long way. Jews and Samaritans did not get along well, partly because of what had happened to the two groups of people during the great wars and the long exiles. The Samaritans had been exiled by the Assyrians many years before. The Jews had been exiled by the Babylonians many years before. It was unusual for Samaritans and Jews even to talk to each other, and very unusual for a man to be talking to a woman in public. But Jesus sees our hearts, and he knew that this woman would accept his gift of eternal life, which he called the "living water."

MY FAITH

The Liturgical Calendar

Catholics divide our year into 6 seasons which are marked by certain colors.

ADVENT is a purple season. We wait for Baby Jesus to arrive in Bethlehem and we wait for Jesus the King of the Universe to come back to Earth.

CHRISTMAS is a white season. For 12 days we celebrate the Birth of Christ

ORDINARY TIME begins with the Baptism of Jesus and ends just before Ash Wednesday.

LENT is a purple season. We prepare for the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Jesus through giving, fasting, and praying.

EASTER is a white season. Jesus is alive!
This season lasts 7 weeks.

ORDINARY TIME is about 6 months long!
