

### SPIRITUAL ADOPTION UPDATE MY HEART STARTED BEATING TODAY!

Thank you to the many parishioners who spiritually adopted newly conceived babies in danger of abortion, praying daily for them until their birth. During the first amazing month of life the baby grows to 10,000 times his size at conception. Between mother and child lies the vital organ called the placenta. Here vessels from mother and baby intertwine without joining, highlighting this newly formed relationship-mutual, nourishing and deeply connected. By the third week the baby's tiny heart begins to beat, pumping blood through the circulatory system. Their spinal cord, brain and nervous system are also developing. #### **SAINTS THIS WEEK**

#### February 23—Polycarp

Saint Polycarp was martyred around 155 AD, on the exact day of his present feast—February 23. Polycarp was 86 years old when a rash of persecution broke out against the local Church. He waited patiently at a farm outside of town for his executioners to come and knock on his door. The Roman view is that Christians were atheists because they rejected the ancient pagan religion. The Roman gods were patriotic symbols—universal symbols of national pride. Roman citizens would walk up the wide marble steps of their temples, make a petition, and then burn incense on the altar of their favorite god. Polycarp simply refused to renounce the truth of what he had heard as a young man from the mouth of Saint John, that a carpenter named Jesus had risen from the dead after His body had been placed in a guarded tomb. And this had happened recently, in the time of Polycarp's own grandparents! Polycarp had learned the faith from one of the Lord's very own Apostles.

#### **New Testament**

#### MIRACLES IN CANA AND JERUSALEM

John 4: 46-5: 18

John records the first miracle at Cana—changing water to wine—as a "sign" that the Kingdom of Heaven had come to earth. He names a second "sign," in nearby Capernaum where he healed a man's son. The man begged Jesus to come to his house. Jesus said instead, "You may go: your son will live." Jesus then went to a feast in Jerusalem. While there, he went to a pool called Bethesda. Many people who were seriously sick stayed there day after day hoping to be the first to reach the water when it was stirred up. One man had been waiting 38 years! Jesus said to him, "Rise up, take up your mat, and walk."

Jesus explained that his work was God's the Father's work, making himself equal to God.

### Symbols and Sacramentals

We know that the 7 sacraments are **REAL** ways in which God shows himself present in our lives. Symbols and Sacramentals are different. They are beautiful reminders of the Sacraments and reminders to pray. Here are some examples. Holy Water, a Shell, and a White Garment remind us of our baptism. The Rosary reminds us to pray with Our Ladv. Candles remind us that the Light of Christ has come to the world. A beautiful Bible teaches us that God's Word is precious. **BOOKS OF THE BIBLE Ezekiel** wrote very beautiful passages including the Vallev of the Dry bones.
