

SAINTS THIS WEEK

(adapted from <u>Companion to the Calendar: A Guide to the Saints and Mysteries of the Christian Calendar</u>
by Mary Ellen Hynes)

March 17—St. Patrick (389-461)

The reason that St. Patrick's Day is so popular in the United States is that many Irish people settled here in the 1800's. St. Patrick was born in England. He was captured and taken to Ireland as a slave when he was 16 years old. As a shepherd for the next 6 years, his feelings of loneliness were so strong that he prayed to God to help him. He escaped and went back to England where he became a priest and then a bishop. Patrick traveled back to Ireland and taught the people about Jesus. He used the 3 leaf clover as a way to explain the Blessed Trinity.

March 19—St. Joseph, husband of Our Lady

A tzaddik is a good person, just and virtuous. This is the word used to describe St. Joseph in Matthew's gospel. There is a Sicilian Lenten custom called "St. Joseph's Table" that honors him as patron saint of the poor. Tables are heaped with meatless dishes, wine and fruit to feed the hungry.

New Testament WALKING ON WATER John 6: 16-21

Has anyone ever walked on water? You would expect that as soon as you started to walk you would also start to sink. But Jesus did walk on water, coming near the boat where the disciples were. They were very frightened when they saw him. They wanted Jesus to get into the boat but instead their boat went straight to the shore.

This miracle came after a long day when Jesus had fed about 5,000 families who had been following him. By the time the disciples had seen the first and the second great miracles, their faith must have been stronger than ever.

We can learn from these two miracles that Jesus can cause miracles to happen in our lives also. God is full of surprises. He can feed us when we are hungry and help us to go where we need to be.

MY FAITH The Human Person

There are no two people who are exactly alike. Even twins are not exactly alike. We have different body sizes, skin and hair and eye color, different talents, and different things that we think about. Jut because someone looks different from us or acts differently, that doesn't mean there is anything wrong with them. People don't have "birth defects" that make them less important; they have "birth differences" that give them new opportunities.

BOOKS OF THE BIBLE

JOEL is a name that means "The Lord is God." During Joel's time there was a great swarm of locusts (flying insects) that covered the land. Joel taught that God is present and there is always reason for hope.
