SAINTS THIS WEEK

(adapted from *Companion to the Calendar: A Guide to the Saints and Mysteries of the Christian Calendar*
by Mary Ellen Hynes)

April 2—St. Francis of Paola
(1416-1507)

It is amazing that anyone in the 1400's lived to be 91 years old. In those days they didn't have the medicines we have now. Francis tried to model his life after Francis of Assisi. He wanted to devote his life to prayer. His parents helped him by giving him a little piece of land on their property. Later he moved to a cave by the sea. People asked for his wise advice. When the king of France (Louis XI) was dying, he thought he could pay Francis to perform a miracle. Francis told the king that God's miracles were not for sale, and instead prepared Louis for a holy and peaceful death. Francis himself died on Good Friday.

April 4—St. Isidore of Seville
(560-636)

Isidore's brother was a bishop. When the brother died, Isidore became the bishop of Seville. He designed and build schools and even wrote the first encyclopedia.

New Testament

JESUS PREACHES AND TEACHES

John chapter 8

How wonderful it must have been to be in Jerusalem when Jesus was teaching and preaching. The people who wanted to kill him kept trying to start arguments with him so they would have an excuse to kill him. They brought him a woman who had been taken in the sin of adultery. They were planning to stone her to death but Jesus started writing something in the dirt. What was he writing? Their sins? He said “Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her.” (John 8: 7) Everyone left. He forgave the woman for her sins.

SPIRITUAL ADOPTION UPDATE "I'M DANCING"

The baby is making rapid progress developing all her external and internal organs. During the second month baby teeth form and her fingers and toes are developing. Ears, nose, lips and tongue can now be clearly seen. The taste buds are forming. The baby responds to touch. If the baby's nose is tickled, she will flex her head backward away from the stimulus. The mother will not feel movement until the fourth or fifth month because the inside of the uterus has no feeling. The baby has to be almost a foot long and weigh about one pound before he or she is large enough to brace a shoulder against one wall and kick hard enough against the opposite wall to dent it outward. Then the mother feels it. The baby can hiccup, make a fist, wake & sleep. The skeleton changes from cartilage to true bone. The central nervous system is now functioning 100,000 nerve cells are created every minute. Brain waves can be recorded by an EEG during this month. Forty muscle sets begin their first exercises. By 8 weeks old body systems are present and the baby is called a "fetus", a Latin word meaning "little one" or "young one". Ultrasound reveals that this little one can now spring & jump-her first dance steps. "Your hands have formed me and fashioned me. With skin and flesh you clothed me, with bones and sinews knit me together." (Job 10: 8-11). Please continue to pray for these little ones.
