SAINTS THIS WEEK

(adapted from <u>Companion to the Calendar: A Guide to the Saints and Mysteries of the Christian Calendar</u>
by Mary Ellen Hynes)

March 8—St. John of God (1495-1550)

John was a homeless child in Spain. He may have run away from his birthplace in Portugal. He spent his life as a shepherd and as a soldier. At age 40 John wanted to do something more meaningful before he died. So he started housing homeless people who had nowhere to go, some of them just out of prison, . He became very ill after diving into a river to save a drowning man. Before he died the Archbishop of Granada promised to care for all John's house guests.

March 9—St. Frances of Rome (1384-1440)

Frances was a very wealthy married woman whose husband supported her love for the poor. She and a friend would dress simply and go through the city with baskets of food. Her castle was ruined during a civil war, but she remained there helping refugees. St. Frances is still honored in Rome.

New Testament THE FEAST OF TABERNACLES John chapter 7

The Feast of Tabernacles is first mentioned in Exodus 23: 16 as a harvest festival. There was a ceremonial pouring of water and in the evening a lighting of many lamps. Also the people made tents outside out of branches. At first Jesus told his family members that he was not going to the festival but he went there anyway. He began to teach in the temple. Jesus taught that anyone who followed him would find rivers of living water. There was a lot of arguing about Jesus. If the Messiah was someone else who would come in the future, how could he possibly do more great signs than Jesus had done? Some wanted to arrest him but were afraid to do it. Nicodemus, who had visited Jesus by night, urged the people not to condemn Jesus without first listening to what he had to say.

MY FAITH Weddings, Funerals, Blessings

A blessing is when the Church asks the **Holy Spirit to make** ordinary things holy. When two people want to live together and raise a family they ask for a blessing from the Church. This is a wedding. A wedding can be simple or fancy. When a person dies the family asks for a funeral blessing to commit the body to its final resting place and to pray that the person will meet Jesus in heaven. Also the priest can bless religious items such as rosaries and Bibles.
