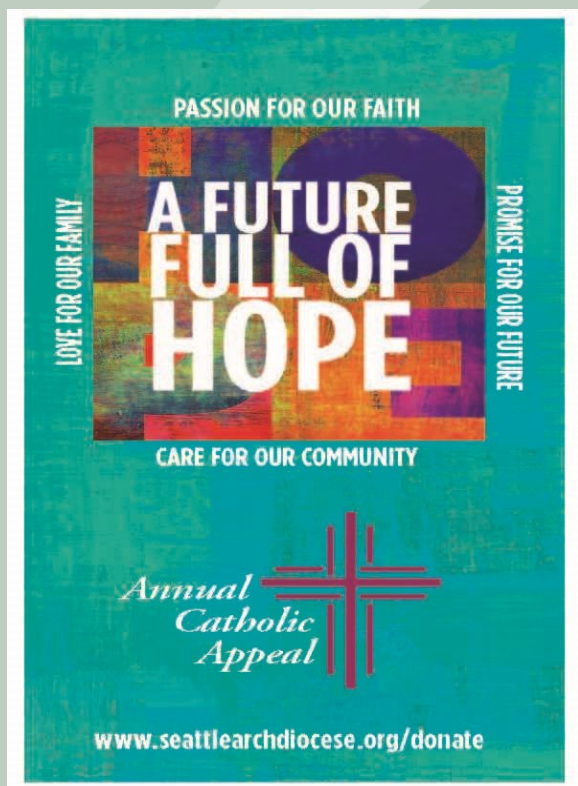

At Home with **Faith**

Talk

Here are some reflection questions to help you have **Great Conversations** with the whole family.

- Ask your children: What does charity mean to you? How can we practice charity as a family? Share what the Church teaches on charity.
- Talk about Jesus' commandment to love your neighbor as yourself. What does this mean and how can your family live this out? Ask for examples.
- Do a daily "weather check" with your family members. Without pressing them, find out what's on their mind as they start and end the day. Everyone's emotions, especially our children's, are subject to some volatility as we come to terms with all the things we love (sports, school, visits with friends, etc.) that we can't do right now.
- At bedtime, after reading with your children, ask them, "What was the best thing that happened today?" and "What was the thing you would most like to change about today?" Then pray with your children thanking them for the good things and asking help with the things that need to get better.

SPIRITUAL ADOPTION UPDATE-THIRD MONTH

"I CAN SUCK MY THUMB NOW!"

In January many of our parishioners spiritually adopted newly conceived babies, making a commitment to pray daily as they grow and develop. Those babies are now twelve weeks old. Their feet are perfectly shaped. Eyelids, fingernails & toenails form and he now has his own set of fingerprints. Their entire body is sensitive to touch and can feel pain. He will tightly grasp an object placed in the palm of his hand. They sleep and wake regularly. Vigorous activity shows distinct individuality. The babies can kick, turn their feet, make fists, move their thumbs, bend their wrists, turn their heads, open their mouths and press their lips together. They "breathe" amniotic fluid to help develop their respiratory systems. He can now squint, swallow and move his tongue. In fact, early this month - around week 9 - he began to suck his thumb. All pretty amazing for one so small. Please remember to pray daily for these little ones!
