



# WHY DOES GOD ALLOW HELL?

Both the Old and New Testaments discuss poverty extensively. One question that arises with regard to this topic is what causes poverty in the first place. An examination of the question shows us several potential causes.

One is systemic oppression, where people are born or forced into a life of poverty, where there is no social mobility, no opportunity to advance. Another potential cause is environmental factors, like fundamentally adverse conditions in nature, which make the production of basic necessities deeply challenging. At the same time, poverty can also be caused by cultural assumptions that prevent people from working toward a better life, like a sense of fatalism dictating that no better future is possible. Another potential cause is personal misfortune, such as illness or family tragedies. Finally, poverty can be caused by bad personal decisions, which can destroy a person's economic situation and can cut off the ability to move forward financially.

The Old Testament has various categories of books, among which is Prophetic Literature, containing the writings of the prophets of Israel, and Wisdom Literature, which presents extensive instructions for day-to-day living. In addressing the question of poverty, Prophetic Literature tends to deal with oppressive socio-economic systems that make and keep people poor. The prophets challenge such systems in no uncertain terms. By contrast, Wisdom Literature tends to focus on personal choice, exhorting people to avoid the sort of mistakes that can plunge someone into a life of poverty.

The Gospels also challenge systemic oppression, especially on the part of those who are in the position of being shepherds of the people. Throughout the Gospels, Jesus critiques the contemporary leaders of Israel, who used their position to live well, while keeping others down. The Torah, the law that the Israelites received from God through Moses, mandated care for one another in society. But many of the leaders did not fulfill the law and instead maintained socio-economic systems that kept people down, allowing the leaders to live well at the expense of the people they were supposed to be caring for.

Many of the ordinary people at the time of Jesus followed his teachings. Among the Israelites, it was mostly the leaders who rejected him. In the parable, the rich man's family does not accept the teachings of Moses and the prophets, nor would they be willing to accept the testimony of someone who came back from the dead. The point would not have been lost on the leaders at the time of Jesus. They themselves did not accept the teachings of Moses and the prophets pointing toward Jesus, nor did they accept the testimony of the Apostles when Jesus resurrected from the dead. The leaders of Israel at the

time of Jesus would have understood that the parable was specifically critiquing them.

Having said that, the parable is directed at all of us as well, offering many crucial teachings. To begin, the parable shows the reality of the afterlife. We do not go out of existence when we die, but we continue to live for eternity. The parable also shows the reality of Hell. As the Church teaches, when we die, we will experience one of three possible states. One is Heaven, which is eternal union with God. The second is Purgatory, which is a state of being saved, but still needing some purification before we can enter Heaven.

The third is Hell, which is the state of being completely cut off from God. Going to Hell is the consequence of one's sinful actions in this life. Our day-to-day actions have eternal consequences, for good or for ill. What we do every day matters - matters eternally. As the parable shows, Heaven and Hell are eternal states. Once in Heaven, we will never leave. But likewise those who go to Hell can never exit Hell either. Therefore, we need to take our everyday choices extremely seriously.

But, the objection goes, if God is all good and all loving, why does he allow Hell to exist? Wouldn't God want all people to go to Heaven? The answer is rooted in love. God is love and he created the world out of love in order to share his love with us. Love presupposes free will. For love to be meaningful, love has to be freely chosen and reciprocated. If God just forced us to accept his love and to love him back, we would not be experiencing his love. We would be nothing more than robots programmed for a task. There would be no relationship.

Thus, God's offer of love to us also entails giving us free will. But free will includes a fundamental risk. When God gives us freedom, the freedom to accept his love, he also takes the risk that some of the beings he has created will reject his love. God's love is our only true fulfillment, our eternal satisfaction and complete joy. And yet, some individuals will use their free will to reject God's love and cast themselves into eternal sorrow and suffering.

God will respect their free will and not force them to do otherwise. In order for love to be meaningful, the foundation of free will must remain, even the choice of some souls to go to Hell. Thus, paradoxically, Hell is a necessary byproduct of love, of the freedom to be able to choose love meaningfully. Let us, therefore, use our free will to accept and reciprocate God's love and thereby choose eternal joy and fulfillment with God in Heaven.


Supports families in need by providing diapers and clothing for children from birth to school age. We are located in the lower Brendan House and are open on Tuesdays from 9AM to 11AM.






